Monkey Bay Wildlife Sanctuary

MBNP is crown land located in central Belize within the Maya Forest Corridor and is protected under the Belize National Protected Areas System. It consists of 2,265 acres of karst topography south of MBWS directly across the Sibun River. It comprises of five different vegetation types that provide key ecosystem services; they include riparian forest, cohune ridge, broken ridge forest, transitional low broadleaf forest, and broadleaf forest.

MBNP boasts several cave systems due to its karst landscape. These cave systems have been actively used in the past by the Mayas for ceremonial activities. The park also consists of over 4km of trail system hikers can immerse in and enjoy scenic views of limestone rocks and hills and if your fortunate, see some of the fauna found within the park. MBNP is rich in bird diversity. Birders can enjoy birding along the Sibun River and thereafter enjoy a refreshing swim in the Sibun River after a long day of hiking in the national park. Visitors can enjoy historical and educational tours with a license guide that can take them to unique natural caverns within the park.
