Towering at an impressive 3,675 feet, Victoria Peak Natural Monument claims its rightful title as Belize's second highest mountain. Yet, its significance goes beyond its lofty elevation. This natural monument is a sanctuary for an astounding array of ecosystems, nurturing a rich tapestry of plant and animal life within its pristine tropical rainforest, adorned with cascading waterfalls and rugged landscapes that form the northernmost wall of the Cockscomb Basins. The monument is a sanctuary where jaguars roam, tapirs find refuge, and exotic birds take flight amidst the lush canopy.
